PYP

We follow the Primary Years Programme (PYP)

The PYP is the framework used to deliver our curriculum which is informed by the National Curriculum.

Each module we study a new unit of inquiry.

The units are transdisciplinary which means they transcend traditional subject boundaries, allowing pupils to explore concepts and skills across different subjects.

Instead of learning subjects in isolation, pupils integrate knowledge and skills from a range of subjects making connections to real-world issues and developing a connected understanding of the world.

For module 1 our unit of inquiry's central Idea: is: **Throughout time and across the globe children's rights and responsibilities have differed.**

The lines of inquiry we will explore are:

- Children's rights and responsibilities
- Challenges, risks and opportunities, children face.
- Ways in which individuals, organisations and nations work to protect children from risk.

The subjects we will teach this unit through are:

English- reading- Street Child by Berlie Doherty and Wonder by R.J. Palacio, writing- diary entries, recounts and letters

History- Victorians

Art- Lowry

PSHE-emotions

Trip- Dockland Museum
